Procurement Services Division
(Procurement Actions) Recommends approval of all procurement actions above the State Competitive bid limit (\$78,500) in accordance with applicable Education Code. There are three professional service agreements below the state bid limit totaling \$578,011 for health benefits consulting, professional development and consultation services, and a special education due process requirements gathering. There are four professional service agreements exceeding \$250,000 for ITD support services and municipal derivatives and bond insurance litigation services totaling \$5.6 million. This report also includes ratification items for 210 Book Purchase Orders totaling \$1,589,237.

Whereas, The Los Angeles Unified School District embraces and celebrates multilingualism among our students;

Whereas, LeáLA, Fería Del Libro en Español de Los Angeles was founded by the Universidad de Guadalajara Los Angeles to promote the importance of Spanish literature and the Latino culture, making it the first Spanish literature book fair in the United States;

Whereas, LeáLA will promote reading books in Spanish in schools beginning January 2011 through April 2011;

Whereas, May is recognized as the Latino Book Month and according to the U.S Census, there are an estimated 4.7 million Latinos living in Los Angeles;

Whereas, 33 percent of District students are English Language Learners and 73 percent of the total student population is of Latino descent and Spanish is their first language;

Whereas, Research strongly suggests that language learning increases academic achievement in literacy development;

Whereas, In order to compete in the 21st Century, today's students need to develop linguistic and cultural literacy in more than one language;

Whereas, Inculcating the habit of reading books in multiple languages at an early age nourishes children's minds and develops flexibility in their learning strategies; and

Whereas, Non-English native speakers should have the opportunity to maintain and advance their home language through continued culturally relevant study; now therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Governing Board of the Los Angeles Unified School District promotes and celebrates multilingualism by proclaiming April as the Festival of Spanish Literature Book Month and by welcoming LeáLA to encourage students to read in their home language, and be it finally

Resolved, That the Board, the Superintendent and his designated staff collaborate in the planning and implementation of April as the Festival of Spanish Literature Book Month, so that the students and families can participate in Spanish literacy based activities and continue to develop a passion for reading as an investment in their future.
