## 99.6% of Parents are Very Satisfied or Satisfied with LAUSD's Early Childhood Education Division programs!

LAUSD Early Childhood Education Division administered a survey asking for parent feedback on the early education services provided to their child. The survey was distributed in September and October 2007. With the school year just underway, the reactions from parents were overwhelmingly positive.

76% of parents report being "Very Satisfied" with the overall program and another 24% report being "Satisfied."

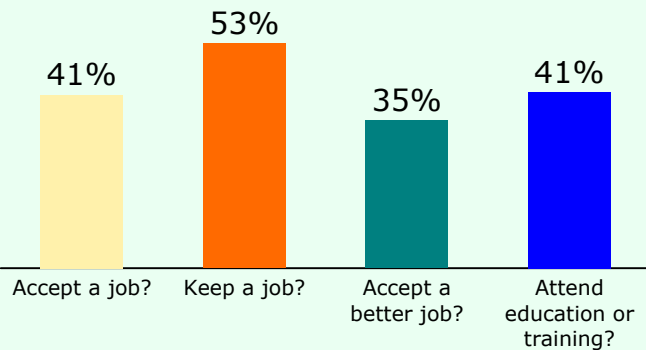
In addition, 67% of parents reported that the program allowed them to either accept a job, keep a job, accept a better job or attend education or training.

This survey is part of the broader Desired Results process that is mandated by the California Department of Education (CDE).

### We Support the Progress of Children and Families using Desired Results!

The Desired Results for Children and Families system documents the progress made by children and families. Every child enrolled in an early education program is assessed using the Desired Results Developmental Profile - Revised (DRDP-R). The results of this tool provide a base of information that educators use to improve their services to children and families. Both the child assessment and the parent survey will be repeated in the Spring.
